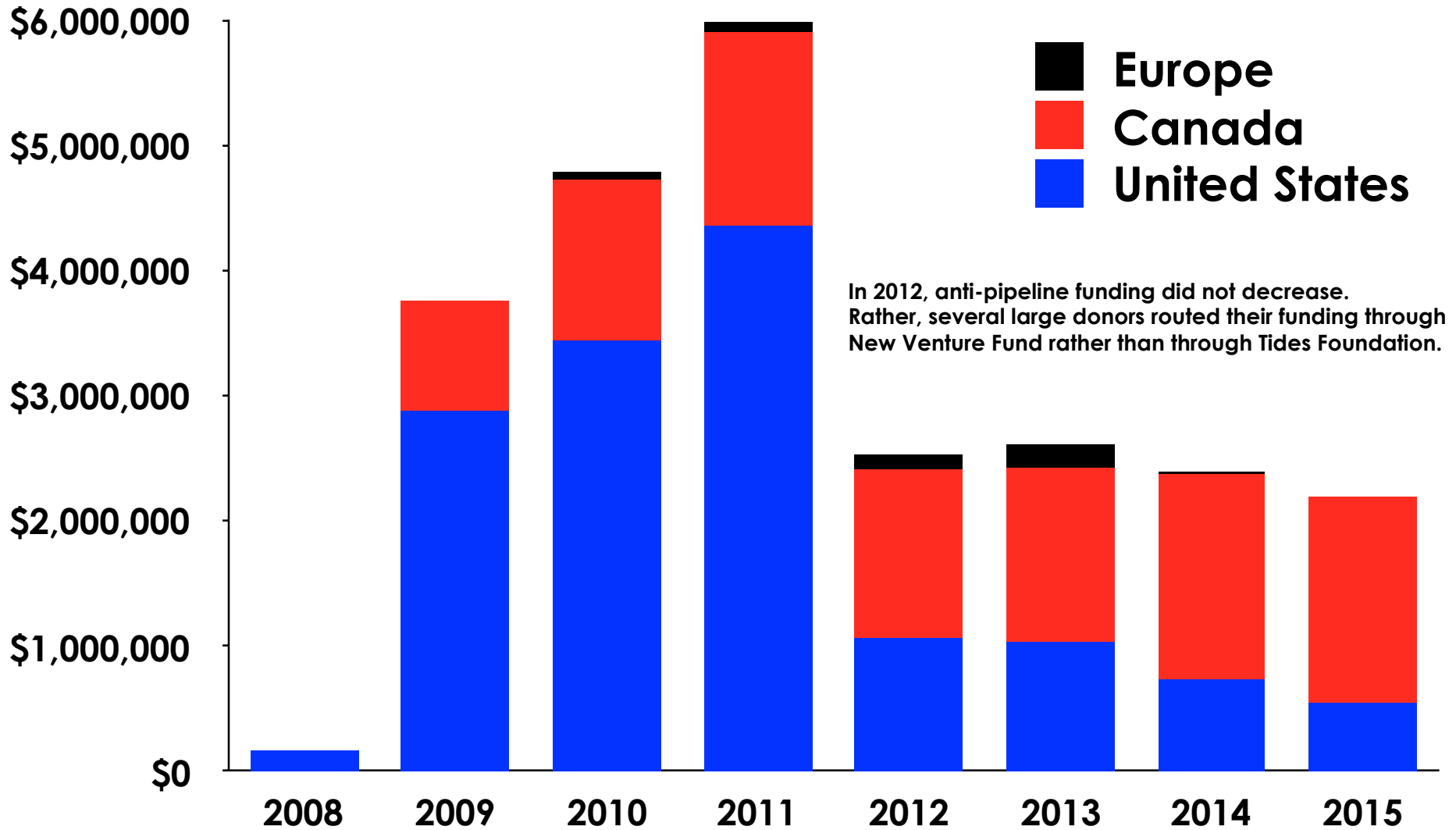


Amounts Paid to Organizations Involved in Anti-pipeline Activism Via The Tides Foundation 2008 - 2015: US\$35 Million
