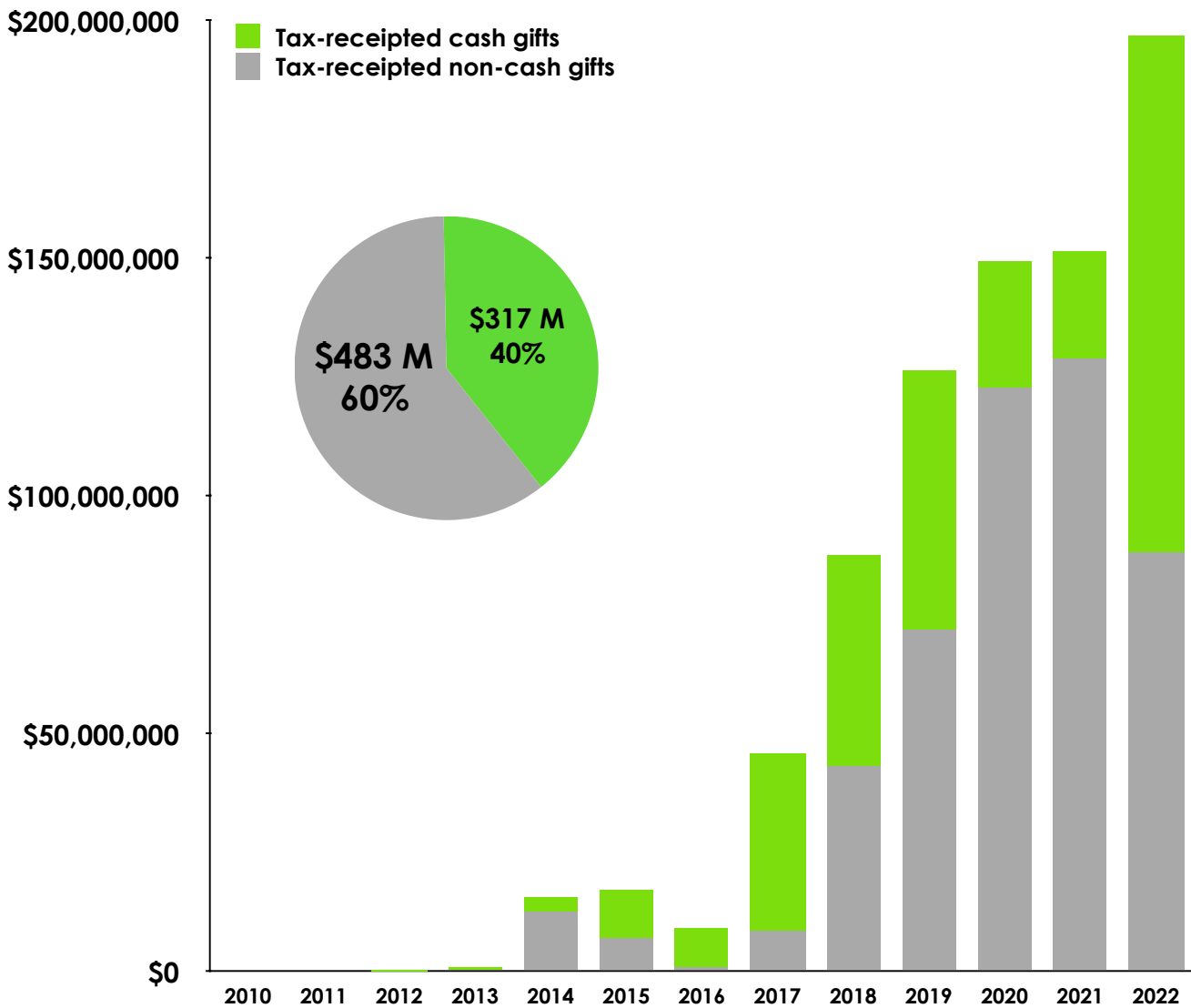

## Charitable Impact Foundation (“CHIMP”) Tax-Received Gifts

**\$800 Million  
(2011-2022)**

Since 2011, tax received gifts reported by CHIMP have increased on a yearly basis from \$150,000 to \$196 million. Non-cash accounts for 60 percent. In 2021, non-cash accounted for 85 percent of tax-received gifts.

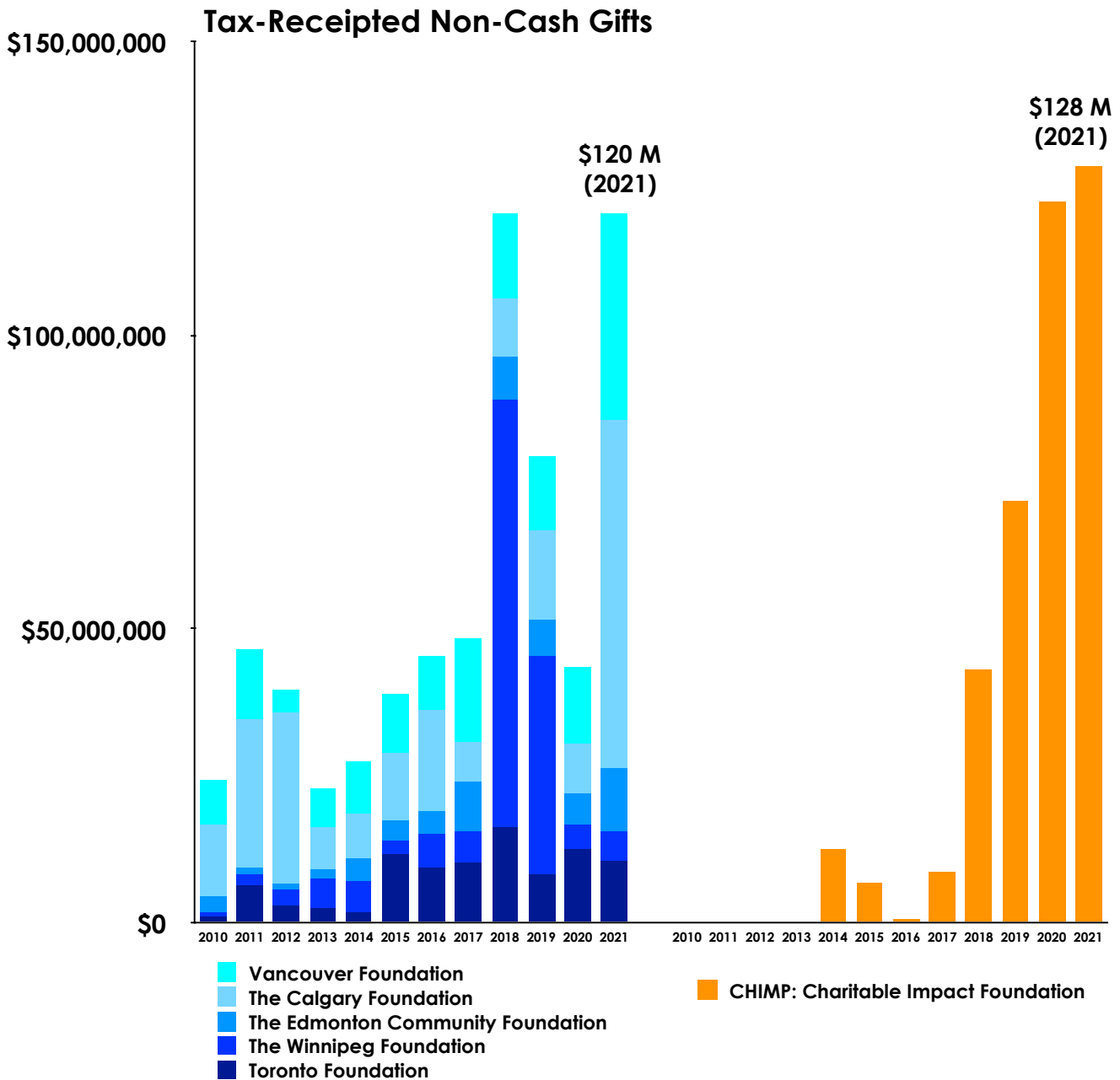

## CHIMP Compared to Major Canadian Foundations: Tax-Received Non-Cash Gifts

To put CHIMP's growth into perspective, consider that by 2020, CHIMP reported more tax-receipted, non-cash gifts than the legacy foundations of Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Winnipeg and Toronto combined.

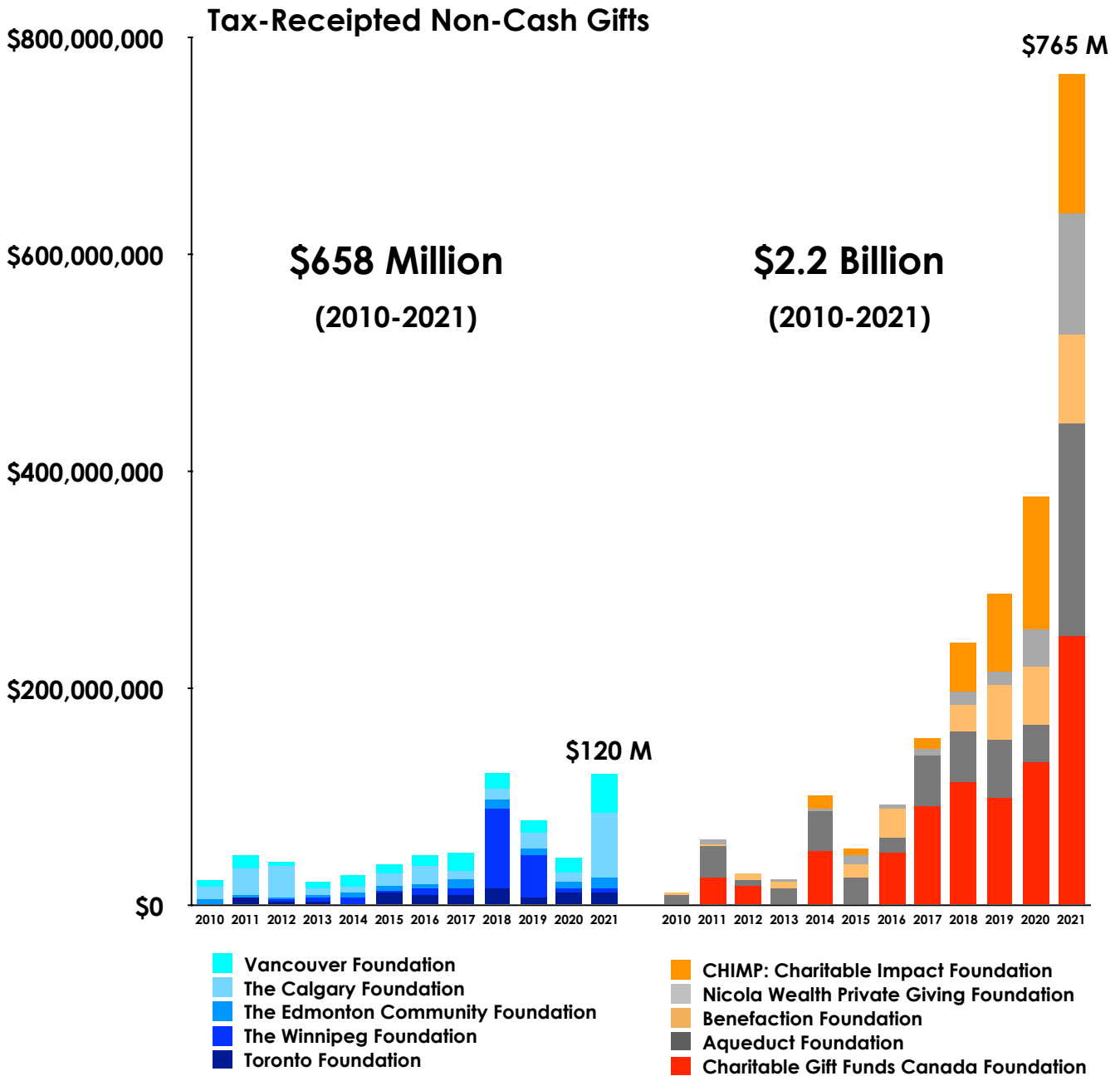

## Tax-Receipted Non-Cash Gifts (2010-2021)

Back in 2010, the legacy foundations of Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Winnipeg & Toronto reported a combined total of \$24 million for tax-receipted, non-cash gifts. That same year, Aqueduct, Benefaction, Nicola Wealth Private Giving & Charitable Gift Funds Canada reported only half that amount, \$12 million. By 2021, these foundations reported \$765 million whereas the legacy foundations reported \$120 million. The difference: \$645 million in just one year.
